## ALWAYS AN AUXILIARIST

Sam Stephenson, 36, resides in Galveston, Texas and along with his father, Sam Sr., has been a member of Flotilla 36 of Boca Raton, Florida for 19 years. Sam grew up on the water according to his Dad so joining the Auxiliary while still in his teens was just another way to further his love and knowledge of the sea.

Now, as an adult, Sam has made the sea his life's work. Sam is currently the Commandant of Cadets at Texas A&M University and is in charge of the school's Maritime program. In his capacity as Commandant Sam is the Master of the Texas Clipper fl, Texas A&M's 394-foot floating classroom.

This past June while on a 90 day training cruise Captain Stephenson and his crew of 140 Aggie Cadets were off the East coast of Florida when they received a MARB from the Coast Guard. Three young men had set out from Ft. Lauderdale, Florida in route to Charleston, South Carolina aboard a just purchased 30 foot sailboat.

East of Jacksonville the 3 young sailors encountered a strong storm and found themselves in 50 MPH winds and 12-foot seas. The vessel lost electrical power and its sail was tom to shreds. Luckily the boat was equipped with an EPIRB that the crew activated. A C130 was launched and after four hours the sailboat was spotted by the plane's crew and the MARE issued.

The Texas Clipper II was 30 miles from the sailboat's position and Captain Stephenson and crew set a course to come to the aid of the floundering vessel. Upon arriving on scene Captain Stephenson ordered that the Texas Clipper II be put in the sailboat's lee in an effort to protect it and its crew from the wind. The Captain then assembled a group of cadets to launch the Clipper's small boat and rescue the three young men from the sailboat.

According to Captain Stephenson the cadets learn man overboard, abandon ship and fire fighting procedures but have never been instructed in the art of recovering persons from another vessel. This was learning from experience at it's best.

In short order the three unfortunate sailors were safely aboard the Texas Clipper II, shaken to be sure, but none the worse for the wear.

The Texas Clipper transferred her guests to a Coast Guard boat off the coast of Charleston and continued it's training mission.
