Every Flotilla Meeting this year has been well attended and I hope enjoyed. Most of them were over by 9 pm and the latest was 9.15pm. At the October meeting there were 70 people present. November 6th is the most important meeting of the year - the Election Meeting and requires a quorum. Please make every effort to be there and help to choose your new Commander and Vice Commander for 2004.

In the near future every Coxswain owning an Operational Facility will be supplied with a PEPIRB (Personal Emergency Position Indicating Radio Beacon) on loan from the Coast Guard. It is to be returned when your vessel is no longer operational.

The USS Reagan will be in Port Everglades from November 11th to the 14th. An Auxiliary vessel will be required daily between 0800 and 2100 to carry out Surveillance Patrols between the Dania Cutoff and the turning basin. Choose the day and time of patrol.

Free Trade Association of the Americas (FTAA) will be held in Miami November 15th through 22nd. However, there will be a vessel owned by Greenpeace that will dock in Port Everglades. The conference is expected to generate protests and it is likely to spread to Port Everglades due to the presence of cruise ships. Auxiliary vessels are required for patrols in and around the Port.

The Governors Conference. November 19 through 23rd at The Boca Hotel.

Auxiliary Vessels will be needed to patrol the Boca and Hillsboro Inlet areas during this period.

Emergency Preparedness & Operations

A reminder to the members in the boat crew program, the hours of patrol have changed. Morning patrols are now from 1000 to 1330 and afternoon patrols are 1330 to 1700. The hours do change with daylight saving time. November is going to be a very busy month. We are responsible not only to have a boat out each Saturday and Sunday but also give support to the Coast Guard for other missions.

November 11 through November 14 – USS Ronald Reagan is coming to Port Everglades. Security will be needed in the form of a vessel patrolling the turning basin to the Dania cutoff canal providing support of Law Enforcement vessels with security for the USS Ronald Reagan. The need is for 1 vessel for each patrol from 0800 through 2100. These patrols can be of whatever length the crew and coxswain feels is appropriate within the operational standards of the Auxiliary

November 15 through November 22 – FTAA conference

The conference takes place in Miami Florida, there will be a vessel operated by Greenpeace that is docking in Port Everglades. The conference generates much protest, so the request is for 1 vessel for each patrol from 0800 through 2100. There is a need to extend to Hillsboro Inlet and Boca Inlet with the same compliment of patrols requested during the same time periods. The length of patrol can be whatever the crew and coxswain feels is appropriate within standards of the Auxiliary.

Governor’s Conference - November 19 through November 23

Vessels will be needed for the Boca Raton and Hillsboro Inlet areas. These dates run conjunctively with the FTAA conference.

ASSISTING WITH HOMELAND SECURITY AWARENESS:

The US Coast Guard is aggressively monitoring and assessing information with other Federal, state and local agencies on potential terrorist threats in the United States to protect our homeland. Public assistance is integral to our overall awareness of dive activity throughout the country and we ask the public to report anything or anyone that looks suspicious or out of place within our ports, waterways and harbors. The following are examples of such activity:

- Unusually large purchases of dive equipment by an individual
- Large purchases of specialized equipment (i.e. closed circuit equipment)
- Inquiries about specific details about critical infrastructure, e.g. bridges, piers, cruise ships
- Purchases by individuals without qualifications
- Any other suspicious activity

If you see anything that may be suspicious, please report the activity to the local United States Coast Guard, Captain of the Port or National Response Center at (800) 424-8802.

We suggest you include the following items in your dive plan to increase your awareness of the area in which you are diving to help prevent yourself from being mistaken as a suspicious person:

1. Contact your local Coast Guard unit and make yourself aware of any current security zones or restricted areas before entering the water.
2. If diving near a designated security zone advise the nearest Coast Guard station or facility of your diving intentions.
3. Be certain not to dive in designated security zones or off limits areas without authorization and proper notification of Coast Guard Security/Law Enforcement personnel.


