First, I want to acknowledge the instructors and aids for our November program:

- Boating Safely, a one-day session held on Nov. 15: Instructors Rick Celestino, Hank Garrow, and Lenny Schwartz; and aids Connie Sprake, Sandy Gardner, Lenny Schwartz, and Kristie Colina.

- GPS, a one-day session held on Nov. 22: Instructors Art Makenian and Mike Gardner, and aids Connie Sprake, Kristie Colina, and Lenny Schwartz.

These sessions conclude another successful year for the Public Education program. Together, this team of dedicated instructors and aids, achieved a challenging schedule:

- Three sessions of Boating Skills & Seamanship (BS&S), with a total of 90 students.
- One session of Advanced Coastal Navigation (ACN), with a total of 23 students.
- Four sessions of the one-day Boating Safely Course, with a total of 83 students.
- Three sessions of GPS class, with a total of 18 students.

This means that 214 south Florida “skippers” now have a better understanding of safe boating, making it a safer and more enjoyable experience for themselves and their passengers. Our graduates come from every walk of life, including doctors, lawyers, fire fighters, law enforcement, teachers, students, private business, and yes, even a few in the computer business. Our graduates read their lessons, studied for the exam, and glowed with pride when they received their certificates.

Flotilla 3-6 can be extremely proud of this substantial contribution to our community and know that we, too, are safer on the water because of it.

Finally, as I pass the PE reigns to Kristie Colina for 2004, I want to thank everyone who contributed to the program this year. Without each of you, we could not have achieved so much, for so many, in such a big way. You have my sincere gratitude for the effort and time you selflessly offered to this service.

It is hard to be believe that this is my last report as FSO-CM.

I want to take this opportunity to thank all of you that volunteered to stand radio watch during 2003. Your time and efforts helped to insure not only the safety of 36's boats and crews but countless number of boaters who enjoy the waters within our area of responsibility.

While I was not successful in getting 100% of our patrols covered you were successful in being there for two thirds of those patrols. I am confident that the Flotilla will do even better in 2004.

One of my goals was not achieved last year and that was living up to our obligation to Division to man North Radio when we were scheduled to do so. I take the blame for this one, and while ignorance is no excuse, a large part of the reason for my failure in this area was my lack of understanding of the importance of North Radio and what it can do to help the watch stander at Station Ft. Lauderdale.

If you don't know what North Radio is let me share with you what I have learned.

Boca Radio along with Pompano Radio and McVey House are scheduled on a rotating basis to have their radio stations manned and operating even if the individual Flotilla does not have boats on patrol that day or weekend. I know none of us enjoys the watch if we do not have a boat out. But by manning Boca Radio on our North Radio weekend can mean a great deal to the watch stander at Station Ft. Lauderdale. Our radio station can now act as guard for boats on patrol from the flotillas in Division 3 that are located to our South. Conversely, if we have boats on patrol and Boca radio is not manned, Pompano or McVey can be our boats' guard. This relieves the Station from guarding our vessels and frees up the Station's watch stander to do the hundred other things that he is responsible for. I didn't realize how much work this can relieve from the Station's staff until late in the year.

It is my hope that you will support the new FSO-CM as much as you have me this past year.
