### **BOW WATCH**

Dave DeBoben and I had the opportunity to attend Newly Elected Officers Training on January 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> in Miami.

This marked the third time I have attended this annual seminar, the first two times dealt with Flotilla administration, key dates for report submission and a little about leadership. This year's version was devoted to change. From the change in uniform, ODU's, to how we need change the way we recruit people into the USCGAUX.

Class sessions involved Ethics, Award Writing, Electronic Communications, Mentoring and Recruiting. The common thread to all of the above topics was how they can help us adapt to the changes that are going on with in the Gold and Silver sides of the Coast Guard.

I want to focus on Recruiting and Mentoring.

There was a time when a prospective member had to own a boat, a radio or possess a special skill that would be beneficial to the USCGAUX. As time went by these qualifications were relaxed and anyone who showed an interest in the Auxiliary and met the age and background qualifications was allowed to join. This resulted in an increase in membership but not really an increase in active members. Today, faced with multi-mission tasking and more dependence upon the Auxiliary to assist in Homeland Security, we must look for members who want to participate and contribute to the fulfillment of our mission and goals. We must let prospective members know that as a member of the USCGAUX they will be expected to participate in Flotilla programs and missions. A time commitment will be needed for training and participation in various programs once trained. A financial commitment will be needed for the purchase of proper uniforms and equipment. Wanting to wear the uniform and ride on different boats are not reasons to join the USCGAUX; having the privilege of wearing the uniform and working on the boats once trained are reasons to join the USCGAUX.

New members, once recruited, need to be mentored if they are going to become viable, active members that contribute to the Flotilla and its purpose. Good mentors are a key factor in the development of good members. Our FSO-MT, Tom Kegan, is looking for Mentors for members who are enter ring the Boat Crew and Coxswain programs. Mentors will be expected to be available to answer questions, assist in task performance and attend some of the crew/coxswain classes when needed.

By the time you read this or FSO-PS, Andrea Rutherford, will have started a BQ class for a group that has expressed an interest in joining the USCGAUX, Mentors will be needed to help these folks learn about the auxiliary, our flotilla and procedures.

If you feel that you have what it takes to be a mentor in either of these areas please contact Tom or Andrea.

Help us become a stronger Flotilla, recruit people who will be active members, and help to mentor them once they have joined us.

Patrol orders, reimbursable or non-reimbursable, are issued using the Patrol Order Management System (POMS) to order the use of an Auxiliary Facility.

Members who do not have access to a computer, the orders will be mailed to you. Fill them out and I shall input them into POMS and send your original to Sector Miami. While filling out your orders be sure to fill out the new fields. You **MUST** fill in the amount of fuel used and the hours underway.




Figure 22.1.2: Sector pattern search (VTS)

Tuesday night and one session on Friday, Feb. 28. Please come out in uniform and support this important Coast Guard Boating Safely Mission.




