A vote will be taken at the April Flotilla meeting (quorum required) to amend our Standing Rules to include the following:

Add a \$2.00 surcharge to the 2009-10 dues billing and add any dues imposed by Division 3 and/or 7th Coast Guard District, in excess of a total of \$22.00, as a surcharge in any subsequent year.

Rational:
The Flotilla incurred a loss of \$210 in year 2008 because we had billed members based on an expected \$22.00 Division/District dues and then they charged us \$24.00. Flotilla 3-6 dues would remain at \$50.00/member. The surcharge would only apply to the 2009-10 dues, unless Division/District dues exceed \$22.00. New members would not be responsible for previous year's surcharge, as they were not members during the period.

Coast Guard Exchange: I have a topic that is a little off of the beaten path this month. Having been to the Coast Guard Exchange at Air Station Miami (Opa Locka) a number of times, I have always wondered what are privileges are as Auxiliarists. The following is the direct quote from Ken Jeziorski of Customer Service at the Coast Guard Exchange System:

“It is good to hear from our friends in the Coast Guard Auxiliary. Coast Guard Auxiliary members have limited shopping privileges at Coast Guard Exchanges. This means a member may purchase anything our exchanges offer with the exception of alcohol and tobacco products. Auxiliary members may also shop at the Army, Air Force and Navy Exchanges, however, only uniform items may be purchased at these exchanges. A USCG Auxiliary ID card (CG-2650) is required to shop at all exchanges.”

Since my last trip to Opa Locka, the Exchange has been fenced in as part of the Coast Guard Station. Thus, you need the Coast Guard Auxiliary ID and the gate security will hold your driver’s license until you leave the base.

So now you know. Military retirees from all branches have unlimited privileges, as they know.

National is in the process of extracting information from AUXDATA into the 3n Program.

We have finished the class room sessions and are proceeding with on the water training and qualification for Boat Crew. Two class members are expected to qualify on March 29, 2009. The rest are new members awaiting their security clearance from DIRAUX.

We will start the Coxswain class on April 14, 2009 at the base at 1900, and continuing on Tuesday evenings. Please give us a heads up if you are planning to take this course. Before qualification you must have 28 hrs on board as crew and have passed the Navigation Rules of the Road test. You can get yourself ready by reviewing your Seamanship Manual. COME ONE - COME ALL
The Great American Cleanup
April 18, 2009
Start time 8 am at the base
Finish time 11 am

We live in one of the most beautiful parts of the country. By volunteering to help out April 18 and help clean up Spanish River Park and the beach, we will be doing our share to keep it one of the cities people want to visit. Let's show them we are proud to live here and are willing to keep it clean. All it takes is a few hours of your time to help clean up the garbage that is left by others who do not respect the environment.

Here are some details:

1. Sign-up sheet at April 2 meeting
2. I will pick up clean up supplies and have available that day. These supplies will consist of trash bags (2 each), blue bags (on request) for recycled bottles and cans, visors, pens/pencils
3. Registration forms - pick up at meeting and if possible fill out prior to clean up and bring with you. After clean up, I will take the registration forms and left over clean up supplies back to Gumbo Limbo.
4. Trash bags should be left at designated locations, securely tied
5. Wear gloves. I'll bring some
6. Do not pick up hypodermic needles or

hazardous waste such as paint, used motor oil and auto batteries. Do not approach large drums. Give info to me and I'll relay it.

7. Watch out for ants, snakes, and jellyfish. Avoid contact with all animals.

The following article is an excerpt from the National Geographic News, dated 9-2003 which highlights the need for events such as the upcoming Great America Cleanup.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency determined that there are between 500 billion to one trillion plastic bags used each year, of which less than 1% is recycled.

1. In 1975, oceangoing vessels dumped 8 million plastics a year. Plastic bags account for 10% of debris washed up on US coastlines.
2. Plastic bags photo degrade breaking into smaller toxic material contaminating soils and waterways and effect on wild life can be catastrophic. Two hundred different species of sea life die due to plastic bags.

Instead of Plastic Bags
Use Cloth.

1. Bangladesh, China and Rwanda banned plastic bags. Ireland taxes plastic bags with a 90% reduction in the use. San Francisco became first U.S. city to ban plastic bags. Oakland and Boston are considering the ban.
2. Use a cloth bag and save 6 plastic bags a week, 24 a month, 288 a year and 22,176 over a lifetime. If one out of 5 people used cloth rather than plastic, 1,330,560,000,000 bags would not be needed.
3. Plastic bags are made from oil; if we reduced usage of plastic bags we would decrease foreign oil dependency. China saves 37 million barrels of oil each year due to ban of plastic bags.
